

Participants needed for research:

Kinship and Relatedness in Third-Party Reproduction

What is this study about?

The goal of this study is to bring voices of donor-conceived people into academic and political discussions about third-party conception in Canada. I ask how donor-conceived persons think of family, self, and biological relatedness. How do these origins matter? How can these perspectives be factored into policy regulations?

Who can participate?

Any donor-conceived person who is:

- Over 18 years old
- Living in the Greater Toronto Area
- Interested in discussing their feelings of relatedness to kin (eg. legal parents, biological parents, siblings, friends, etc.)
- Fluent in English

What's involved?

Your participation is entirely voluntary and would involve one 60- to 90-minute in-person interview in June 2019, with possible email follow-up. During the interview, we will collaboratively create a new form of kinship diagram through which we'll discuss relatedness – this is like a family tree, but it also incorporates people not connected by genetics or law.

In appreciation of participants' time, each collaborator will receive an artistic representation of the kinship diagram we create.
